

Music development plan summary: Exwick Heights Primary School

This is a summary of how our school delivers music education to all our pupils across three areas – curriculum music, co-curricular provision and musical experiences – and what changes we are planning in future years. This information is to help pupils and parents or carers understand what our school offers and who we work with to support our pupils' music education.

Part A: Curriculum music

This is about what we teach in lesson time, how much time is spent teaching music and any music qualifications or awards that pupils can achieve.

- Music is taught in half-termly blocks, an hour a week, alternating with computing.
- All children from Pre-school to Year 6 also take part in half an hour of singing once a week, led by a specialist.
- There are two specialists in the school: Jane Mabin and Chris Willett. Jane Mabin oversees curriculum music and teaching / learning for EYFS and KS1 and Chris Willett for KS2.

- Our curriculum offering is based upon the Kapow scheme of work, ensuring that the learning is spiral; continuously embedded and looped throughout the children's time at Exwick Heights. A particular strength of the Kapow programme, other than ensuring curriculum coverage, is the quality of provision offered for non-specialist teachers. Each lesson contains a 'how-to video' and / or a 'watch first', ensuring that practitioners are fully equipped with the skills, knowledge and confidence needed to deliver high-quality curriculum music sessions.
- The two specialist teachers ensure that whole class instrumental sessions form an integral part of the curriculum. Ukulele and Violin are taught at KS1 (the school have their own sets) and a rolling programme of Guitar / Keyboard / Djembe drums feature at KS2 (this will depend to some extent on availability of instrument hire from DMH).

Part B: Music Tuition, Choirs and Ensembles

This is about opportunities for pupils to sing and play music, outside of lesson time, including choirs, ensembles and bands, and how pupils can make progress in music beyond the core curriculum.

- Exwick Heights offers private music tuition in the following instruments: Violin, Piano, Woodwind (clarinet, flute, saxophone), Drums, Guitar and Singing.
- Lessons are taken in 20 min / half slots. Some children receive 1:1 lessons, others are part of a small group with up to 4 children.
- PP children receive fully subsidised lessons on one instrument.
- Teachers at the school either operate through Music Devon or cover the invoicing and administration of the lessons themselves.
- Regular music 'showcases' are held each year (especially in September) to recruit new students and to celebrate the work of the current students.
- An after-school choir is held weekly, co-ordinated by Chris Willett. This draws children (invite only) from Years 4 to 6. There is no fee for this.

- Other ad-hoc choirs and ensembles are formed when opportunities arise eg. station carol singing group (Year 2), community fete group (Year 2, 3 and 4), Exeter Cathedral singing group (Year 3, 4, 5 and 6), small instrumental ensembles for Christmas performances (Years 2-6). There are no fees for these groups. Rehearsals normally take places during school time.

Part C: Musical experiences

This is about all the other musical events and opportunities that we organise, such as singing in assembly, concerts and shows, and trips to professional concerts.

Musical Experiences 2023/24 academic year included:

- Singing in assembly (Reception – Year 6)
- Year 2 harvest celebration
- Christmas performances as follows:
 - Pre-School Christmas assembly
 - Reception nativity
 - Year 1 and 2 Nativity
 - Year 3 and 4 Christmas Production
 - Year 5 and 6 Christmas Production
 - Carol singing at the local station
- Choir events in the community (local fete) and school summer fair
- Visiting groups / musicians (in addition to the visiting teacher showcases detailed above)
 - Marine band
 - Stringbean group
- Year 6 production (*The Lion King*)
- Exeter Cathedral Outreach Project
- Ukulele parent workshop
- Samba band performed at summer fair
- Year 6 singers performed at summer fair

Events planned for 2024/25 seasons:

- Harvest festival for Pre-School and Reception
- Instrumental teacher showcases
- Christmas events for ALL year groups (Pre-school and Reception nativity, Year 1 and 2 celebration of Christmas, Year 3 and 4 and Year 5 and 6 Carols in the Playground)
- Community Events with the choir
- Stringbeans
- Parent workshops: Ukulele and Violin
- Whole class instrumental outreach work with trust schools (eg. Whipton Barton Federation)
- Year 1 and 2 Easter event
- Summer concert for Years 1 to 6
- Other visits by local groups, as and when the opportunities arise.

We are supported by Devon Music Hub who occasionally suggest visiting groups or soloists. We do not charge the children for taking part in any of these events.

In the future

This is about what the school is planning for subsequent years.

- Add brass tuition to the list of available teachers (trumpet, cornet, trombone). Aim to have done this by June 2025
- Work towards setting up two instrumental ensembles: recorders and a small orchestra (complete summer 2024)
- Long term goal – set up orchestra / music centre as a centre of excellence for Exeter primary schools. Children attend EHPS once a week to enjoy an ensemble and other musical activities, led by Jane Mabin (end of summer 2026 / 27)
