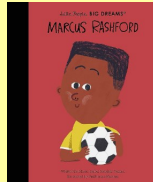
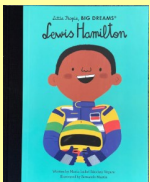
Reading

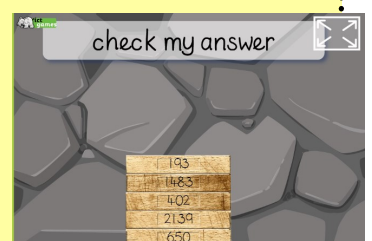
