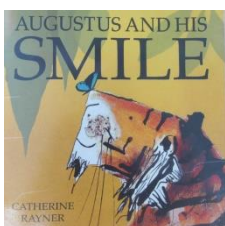
Please find below some ideas for guiding your children's learning at home. Remember, you can email photographs or observations of your child's Home Learning to:

English

Our text for this half term is Augustus and His Smile! Can you re-tell the story to your adult at home, using the actions we have learnt to help you?

As part of our grammar work linked to this text, we have been talking about verbs. Make a list of all the verbs (action words) that you can think of. Take photos of yourself actually doing them if you can (walk, jump, eat, smile etc). If you want to extend your thinking, try to explore some really powerful, interesting verbs for movement – like pounce, crawl, slither or clamber. Talk about them with your adult and either record yourself saying them or write them down.
