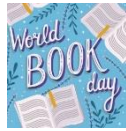

Maths

Can you go on an odd and even number hunt around your house / street / area / local supermarket / the whole city?! Write a list of all the different odd and even numbers that you spot (look on the front of buses, at door numbers, car registration plates and at prices in shops – numbers really are everywhere!). Write all the numbers that you see down on two lists – one for odd numbers and one for even.

Remember to look at the last digit (the ones column) to help you work out whether your number is odd or even (32 = even 43 = odd)

Before we begin a unit in computing about music making, we have been thinking about how music makes us feel. Last week we listened to *Mars* and *Venus* from a piece of music called *The Planets*.
